Without financial assistance, many children, families and adults would not be able to experience the programs offered at these YMCA branches. Your gift of any amount makes a difference. It is estimated that every year **1.6 million youth** run away from home and **800,000** become victims of **Sex Trafficking** within the first **48 hours**. Childhood trauma also attributes to young people being vulnerable to sex trafficking. Research shows that all it takes is **one stable, consistent, and caring adult** to change the trajectory of a **child's life**. The YMCA's Youth Service Bureau (YSB) Youth Advocacy Program works to build healthy relationships with at-risk youth.

Sierra felt isolated and alone when her parents became preoccupied with a family crisis. When she didn't get the attention she needed, she became involved with an adult who took advantage of her vulnerability. Sierra's experience is common among girls her age. According to a recent study **11– 14 is the typical age of recruitment for sex trafficking**. Although Sierra was sexually abused; fortunately she was not a victim of sex trafficking.

In 2019, she participated in our human trafficking prevention program which focuses on the dangers of unhealthy relationships. Sierra has come to be known for her intellectual and emotional intelligence. "I've changed a lot. I realize I can't depend on anyone else for my happiness," said Sierra. Sierra became open to encouragement and guidance from those around her which helped her see that she can rely on several adults who care for her and believe in her. She has begun to learn to love herself. She has also been brave enough to share her story with others and help them find their own voice.
